Funding is available to support matriculated students who are deaf, deaf blind, or blind to purchase note takers, provide reader services and/or interpreter services. (Readers Aid Program funds cannot be used for tuition, maintenance fees, tutoring, guide services, or textbooks.)

Are You Eligible?

Eligible students must: Have a severe to profound hearing loss (70dB or more) or a speech discrimination of less than 70%;

OR

Be legally blind (meaning 20/200 vision in the better eye (with best correction))

AND

Be a legal resident of New York State;
Be matriculated or actively working to earn a certificate through a degree granting institution of higher education approved by the New York State Board of Regents.
